San Diego County’s Aging and Disability Resource Connection (ADRC) was established in 2004. In 2006, the core partnership of the ADRC expanded to include Access to Independence, the Independent Living Center for San Diego and Imperial Counties. In 2013, San Diego County’s ADRC was the first in the state of California to receive the designation as a fully operational ADRC.

San Diego County’s ADRC is a network of formal and informal partners. The ADRC formal partners include: Access to Independence and 211, which have signed MOUs with the County; County programs; and long term services and support providers, hospitals and managed care health plans that are contracted with the County. The Long Term Care Integration project (LTCIP), an informal coalition of stakeholders that include more than 800 consumers, caregivers, healthcare and social service providers supports the ADRC.
