





How Can You Be a Partner in Home Modification?





- 1. Embed home assessments into programs
- **2. Partner** with home modification service providers
- 3. Educate program participants about **home modification funding possibilities**
- 4. Educate program participants with **consumer direction**, **educational materials**, **and videos**
- 5. **Refer** program participants to home modification services

How to Partner?



- Refer to Rebuilding Together, Habitat for Humanity for service delivery
- Work with State Medicaid Waiver Programs that provide funds to modify homes of individuals at-risk of institutionalization
- Educate persons aging with a disability about home modification and repair services as part of their rehabilitation plan
- Weatherization experts could do a falls risk screening and make simple modifications
- Participate in coalitions and task forces

Tips for Approaching Partners



Collect and share relevant Census data to demonstrate the home modification need in your state or community – who could benefit

- % of the population age 65 and older
- % of the population under age 65 with a disability
- Rate of homeownership
- Poverty rate
- Median household income

Describe your services, resources, and expertise to effectively address these needs

Tips for Approaching Partners and Sustaining Partnerships




- Communicate what impact your partnership could have and how it would support your partner's goals and mission
- Look for mutually beneficial strategies
- Once you begin a partnership, track key successes to demonstrate the impact of your efforts, help sustain the relationship, and secure new ones




