




Philosophy

- Most people want to live as independently as possible for as long as possible.
- ALTSA embraces the belief that individuals with high care needs can be supported in the community in a variety of settings by offering waiver and state plan services that provide alternatives to institutionalizations.
- Goal: Offer options to individuals requiring long-term care services in the least restrictive setting while honoring client choice and preference.

ALTSA Housing Team

- Statewide team of Housing Program Managers who work to administer housing resources and Supportive Housing services to ALTSA eligible clients.
- Housing team acts as liaisons between field, various contractors and available Long-Term Services and Supports.
- Increase housing resources for ALTSA clients.

Housing Collaboration Work

Collaboration with:

- WA State Housing Trust Fund
- WA State Housing Finance Commission
- Department of Commerce
- All 37 Public Housing Authorities throughout WA State
- Local housing developers, nonprofits, and property management companies.



HCS Partnership with Spokane Housing Authority

- 2016 HCS created RFP and accepted Spokane Housing Authority's (SHA) proposal to administer the ALTSA subsidy statewide.
 - Contract provides administrative fee
- HCS & SHA collaborated to develop a program that could be administered like a Housing Choice Voucher but incorporated the flexibilities HCS needed.
 - Housing Committee established to create exception to policy process
- Contract term is three years. Initial contract \$130k/2 years; most recent <u>\$8 million/3 years</u>.

- Innovation, collaboration and flexibility
- Braiding together funding and programming
- Looking for loopholes



Innovations that Grew out of the Partnership

- User friendly and low barrier application process and timely voucher issuance.
- Centralized subsidy administration statewide.
 - $\,\circ\,\,$ Established interlocal agreements with PHAs for local HQS inspections
- Dedicated staff on both HCS and SHA teams focused on ALTSA subsidy.
 - $\circ~$ Efficient communication and coverage to keep processes moving forward
- HCS provides training and outreach to field staff and contracted providers.
 - $\circ~$ Creation and sharing of educational materials
 - \circ Monthly drop in training sessions
 - Quarterly Informational Webinars
 - $\circ~$ Meeting and trainings with community partners
 - o <u>Discharge planning conferences</u>






