The National Center for Applied Transit Technology (N-CATT) is now accepting applications for transit agencies to receive one-on-one technical assistance through the Center's <u>Strategic Technology Technical Assistance</u> <u>Teams (STTATs)</u>. N-CATT will work with transportation providers to navigate a technology challenge or opportunity that results in a useful starting product for the agency, such as an implementation plan or ready-to-go technology solicitation. Federal Opportunities

USDOT Request for Information

To promote equity in public transportation, the U.S. Department of Transportation has published a <u>Request for</u> <u>Information</u> (RFI) in the Federal Register to seek public comment on ways to improve the accessibility of public transportation facilities for people with disabilities. The Department strives to provide equitable access so that people with disabilities are able to use and navigate public transit with the same ease, reliability, and independence as any other user. Input from transit riders, adaptive technology professionals, and the transit industry is critically important in informing USDOT as it contemplates potential enhancements to the <u>ADA</u> <u>standards</u>. Innovative Coordinated Access and Mobility Grants

FTA announced the availability of \$4.7 million in Fiscal Year 2023 competitive grant funding for projects that improve access to vital services for older adults and people with disabilities, and in low-income communities. FTA's Innovative Coordinated Access and Mobility (ICAM) Grants, supports public transportation projects that improve state and regional coordination and will help advance the goals of the President's Executive Order on Advancing Racial Equity and Support for Underserved Communities Through the Federal Government. Applications for funding will be evaluated based on criteria outlined in the Notice of Funding Opportunity in the Federal Register including how the project will enhance access and mobility to vital community services for older adults, people with disabilities, and people of low income. An additional \$4.8 million is authorized for Fiscal Year 2024 and FTA may award additional funding that is made available to the program prior to the announcement of project selections. Applications are due by 11:59 p.m. ET Tuesday, February 13, 2024.
