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Data to Inform Policy: ASPE's Work on Direct Care Workers

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ASPE & Direct Care Workforce Data

- The Assistant Secretary for Planning and Evaluation (ASPE) advises the Secretary of the Department of Health and Human Services on policy development in health, disability, human services, data, and science; and provides advice and analysis on economic policy.
- Policymakers need data on direct care workforce to:
 - Meet growing demand for these workers
 - Improve workforce planning efforts
 - Improve access to high-quality services
 - Inform policies to support these workers
 - Evaluate policy impacts

Improving Data on the HCBS Workforce

- Identify priority populations of workers
- Identify priority data needs, policy questions and gaps in knowledge
- Identify research questions to refine key domains, data elements, and survey/data characteristics
- Examine how federal data sources address the domains and data elements, and necessary survey/data characteristics
- Identify where gaps are in existing data sources
- Identify opportunities for filling these gaps and/or new data collection efforts
