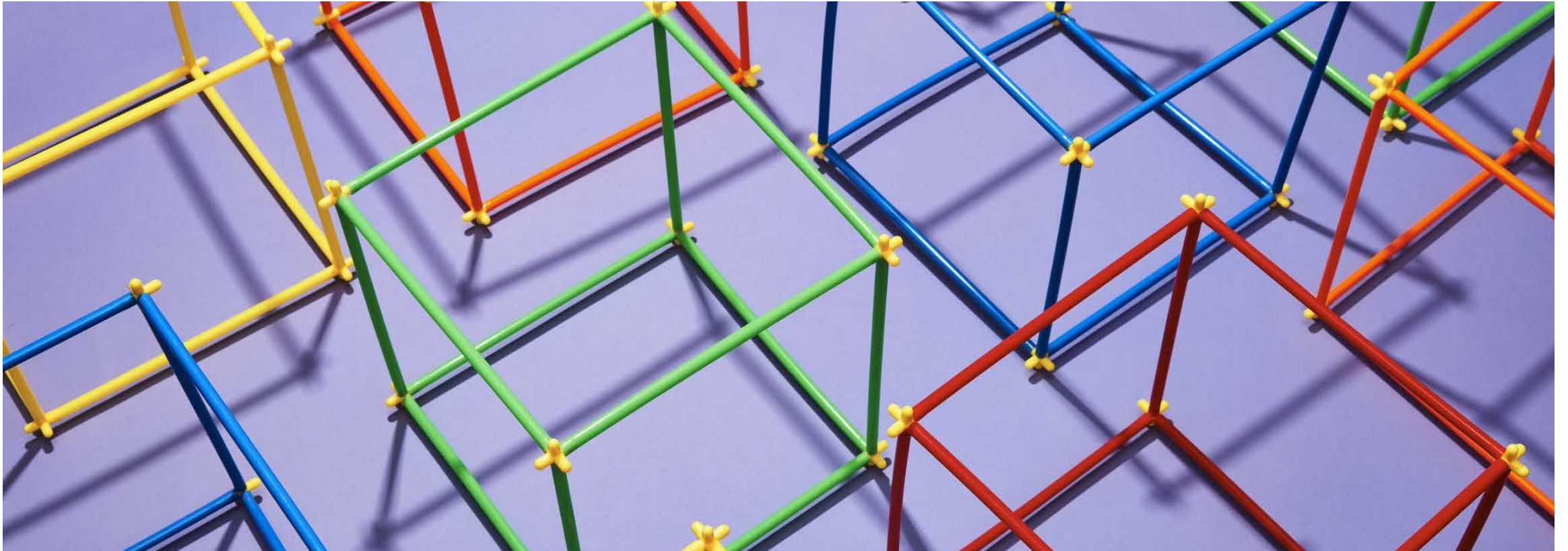

Getting Outside the Box with Data Strategies



Core Components to Data Driven Approaches

- 1. Defining data goals** – important first step and can encompass a variety of objectives
- 2. Partnerships** with other sectors have been used to identify individuals eligible for and most in need of housing and housing-related supports and services, to leverage resources, better plan for care transitions, and improve care coordination
- 3. Buy-in from key leaders and partners** – identifying a champion; interagency councils have driven data sharing and innovations

More Fundamentals

4. **Infrastructure** investments and planning for ongoing operations and maintenance, data and analytic capacity
5. **Navigating privacy and confidentiality protections and legal frameworks** – the development of data use/sharing agreements, the approval process for data sharing requests, and consent/release of information processes. Initiate the data-use agreement (DUA) process early, as it often takes more time than you think it will.

Survey data activities that may already be occurring in your state or locally that can be leveraged

And one more...

- 6. Eligibility and Access** – determining eligibility criteria and process of identification for services and ensuring this is aligned with process for housing eligibility and access at the local level. Some states and communities use HMIS and/or the CoC's By-Name List to establish eligibility and to prioritize participants for available housing options

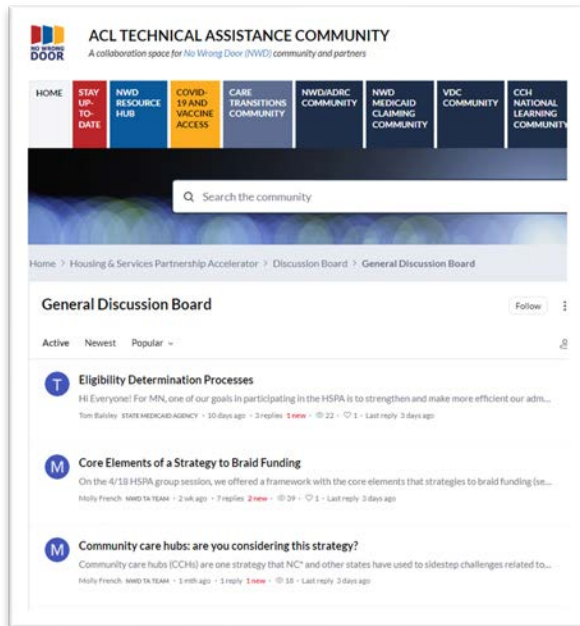
