


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

# The Value of Centers for Independent Living in Addressing Homelessness

- Best suited to provide access to creative solutions, resources, supportive services for people with disabilities.
- Increase in serving people with disabilities and older adults experiencing homelessness.
- We all serve the same people.

# What is Assistive Technology?

Assistive Technology (AT) is any item or piece of equipment that is used to increase, maintain, or improve the functional capabilities of individuals with disabilities in all aspects of life, including at school, work, home, and in the community.



### Assistive Technology Act Programs

How do AT Programs serve people throughout the lifespan to address needs in education, work and community living? The mission of the 56 AT Act Programs is to serve people with all types of disabilities, of all ages, in all environments, and provide an array of services to meet functional needs.

The 21<sup>st</sup> Century Assistive Technology Act or the Assistive Technology Act of 1998, as Amended.

The overall goal of the AT Act is to increase access to and acquisition of AT devices and services through a comprehensive set of state level and state leadership activities.

# Assistive Technology as a Component for Home Accessibility

- AT, DME, home mods increase accessibility of existing housing.
- AT enables people to live safely and stably in the community.
- AT for daily living activities, home safety, environmental controls, and smart home devices.
- AT device demonstrations, device loans and financing resources.

#### **Continuums of Care (CoC)**

- Consist of a group of community-wide agencies committed to the goal of ending homelessness.
- Are funded by U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development, which awards over \$2 billion each year to approximately 400 CoCs.
- Allocate funds to local nonprofits, state and local governments, and public housing authorities to fund specific projects designed to reduce homelessness.

### What is a CIL?

- CILs (Centers for Independent Living) are peer-run support centers for people with disabilities.
- CILs traditionally don't operate housing or residential services. Instead, they promote integrated, independent living opportunities in the community.
- However, finding accessible and affordable housing for CIL consumers has always been a challenge, and people with disabilities are at increased risk for homelessness.
   Because of this, AIM decided it needed to act and shift away from tradition in an innovative way.



# AlM's Approach

- In 2017, AIM began to explore how it could create housing opportunities for people with disabilities most in need. We applied for a grant opportunity to provide permanent, supportive housing to people with disabilities who were homeless.
- AIM started a new 501(c)(3) to hold property (AIM Community Living), while AIM Independent Living Center would provide the onsite supportive services.



### **AIM Now**

 Currently, AIM operates two permanent, supportive housing projects. They are independent and integrated in the community. A third is nearing the startup phase, and AIM has secured two additional PSH grants, with a target opening of 2025, pending capital support.



# AlM's Partnerships

- Through the process, AIM had to work with the local CoC for support. AIM learned more about the local system of homeless services, and we provided our insight and expertise on disability.
- The partnership proved so fruitful that AIM was asked to join the CoC board, and later on, I was asked to consider running for co-chair. I've served in that capacity since 2021.
- As a representative of the CoC, AIM acts in the best interests of all people who are homeless, but we continue to ensure that the system considers disability in its strategies and planning.



### AlM's Partners

- AIM works hand in hand with CARES of NY, the collaborative applicant and partner of the CoC. They act as the executive arm of the CoC through their paid staff.
- AIM worked to increase the supply of affordable, accessible housing in the state. AIM has sought assistance and expertise from the state's Assistive Technology (AT) program, Technology-Related Assistance for Individuals with Disabilities (TRAID). This program provides short-term loans that, in part, allow people to access their homes.
- These partners are also working to provide solutions to homelessness and housing instability for the people of New York by making existing housing more accessible.



# **Partnership Best Practices**

- Partnerships can help bridge the gaps in service delivery.
   Understanding the process and red tape of various regulations and programs allows for a greater understanding of how best to serve shared populations.
- Make a conscious decision to step outside of your comfort zone and use your voices to participate in more programs and expand the partnership network being built.
- If you ensure the right people are at the table and you lean upon their expertise, innovative solutions present themselves. Then it's all about making those solutions work within the confines of program regulations.



# **Success Story**

A resident in AIM's permeant supportive housing said,

"Transitioning from a skilled nursing facility to this program gave me opportunities that I had not had nor would have had. It gave me the opportunity to transition to a nice, safe, and affordable unit. I had literally nothing and would not have had anything. It is allowing me to be out in public – due to my disability, I thought I would always be stuck inside. Meeting friends, having the support here has certainly helped my mental health."



# **Housing and Community Transition**

Help individuals move into independent living options

## **TRAID** and Collaboration

Each of the 12 TRAID Centers work with various community organizations in their region

Collaboration can turn into technical assistance

- Adirondack Regional Technology Center (Plattsburgh) working with the Alzheimer's Disease Assistance Center's Caregiver Support Initiative (CSI)
- Wraparound Services of the Hudson Valley: Project ACT, assists people being discharged from nursing homes, hospitals, rehab facilities, etc.



# **Home Modification**

- TRAID provides temporary AT device loans
  - Individuals who utilize AT, family members, etc.
  - TRAID can loan some devices like temporary grab bars, door alarms, and ramps depending on what each center keeps in their inventory
- Other resources in New York for home modification include:
  - Waiver programs
  - Low interest assistive technology loan programs
  - Community organizations





## What is a Continuum of Care (CoC)?






CoCs are designed to promote a community-wide



## Ensuring a diverse board that is reflective of the community served

Housing and Urban Development Requires: The CoC Board must be representative of relevant organizations and/or projects serving homeless populations and subpopulations within the Continuum of Care's geographic area.

An example of this: NY 501 added AIM to its Board

## Ensuring a diverse board that is reflective of the community served

Fresh perspective = good level setting questions

Benefits:

- Gain representative input on how to prioritize CoC funding
  - Expand collaboration to meet housing needs of those experiencing homelessness and with disabilities
    - Share best practices from different systems of care


