Mission Statement	<p>Wyoming APS Program's mission is to improve the overall health, safety and well-being of Wyoming's elderly, disabled and/or vulnerable adults by partnering with state and local entities, judges, legal representatives, senior centers, local community mental and medical health providers, law enforcement, Wyoming Guardianship Corporation, and other agencies.</p> <p>The Wyoming APS Program, in partnership with other agencies, assesses safety and risk of elderly, disabled and/or vulnerable adults, then arranges or refers services for him/her based on individual needs.</p> <p>The mission aligns with the vision in keeping elderly, disabled and/or vulnerable adults safe at home and giving each adult an opportunity for success, and supporting the people who support the adult.</p>
