

Title III-C Data Elements and Definitions

This document provides the essential programmatic data elements required for Title III-C reporting in the State Performance Report.

Title III-C Services — Cluster 1

Cluster 1 services are services provided for older adults under the Older Americans Act (OAA) Title III for which activities of daily living (ADL) limitations and instrumental activities of daily living (IADL) limitations characteristics are reported in addition to the other consumer demographics and characteristics. Cluster 1 services include home-delivered meals, personal care, homemaker and chore services, adult day care/health, and case management.

Title III-C Services — Cluster 2

Cluster 2 services are services provided for older adults under OAA Title III for which ADL limitations and IADL limitations characteristics are not reported. Cluster 2 services include congregate nutrition, nutrition counseling, and assisted transportation.

A **Cluster 3 non-registered service** is a service provided using OAA funds in whole or in part for which demographic and consumer characteristics are not reported to ACL/AoA. The services for older adult consumers under Title III-C include nutrition education services.

- Consumer demographic information is reported in the aggregate for Persons Receiving Registered Services (Clusters 1 & 2).
- For Clusters 1 & 2, each demographic element is intersected by At or Below Poverty.
 - For Cluster 1 only, each demographic element is intersected by At or Below Poverty, ADL 3+, and IADL 3+.
