Goals, Strategies, and Activities

The overall purposes of this 3-year Sustainable Systems grant are to:

- Goal 1: Significantly increase the number of older adults and adults with disabilities who participate in and complete evidence-based self-management education and support programs to improve their confidence in managing their chronic condition(s).
- Goal 2: Implement new and innovative funding arrangements, including contracts and collaborations with multiple sustainability partners, to support evidence-based chronic disease self-management education (CDSME) and support programs during and beyond the grant period. Additionally, embed programs into an integrated, sustainable evidence-based prevention program network via centralized, coordinated processes.

The Washington Department of Social and Health Services (DSHS) and its partners will:

 Develop a pilot project testing the feasibility of a sustainable, regionalized approach for providing evidence-based CDSME programs;

- Create a regionalized hub and spoke or "dandelion" business model for providing CDSME;
- Increase access to CDSME for underserved, primarily rural populations;
- Create a dual, bi-directional referral and reporting network to identify and track CDSME participants' health care utilization and other outcome measures.

Anticipated Results

The DSHS and its partners propose to achieve the following results:

- Engage 448 primarily rural older adults and adults with disabilities with the education needed to effectively manage one or more chronic conditions;
- Achieve a participant completion rate of 71%;
- Secure one sustainability partner;
- Deliver 64 workshops in seven counties;

- Create a business plan outlining sustainability within a "hub and spoke" model; and
- Determine the return on investment of CDSME programs.

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
